LAUNCH OF A LIFE SAVING PARTNERSHIP IN MANATEE

Kevin DiLallo, CEO at Manatee Healthcare Systems, was among the first in line to roll up his sleeve and donate blood as Suncoast Communities Blood Bank (SCBB) officially became the sole provider of blood products and blood services to both Manatee Memorial Hospital (MMH) and Lakewood Ranch Medical Center (LRMC).

In addition to supplying blood products, SCBB serves as the transfusion reference laboratory for these two Manatee County hospitals and the provider of direct therapeutic patient services. "Suncoast Communities Blood Bank has a distinguished reputation for providing outstanding customer service to its hospitals, patients and blood donors," says Mr. DiLallo. "They have been in the area for over 60 years, and we welcome them as a vital partner."

New Friends

When WCTQ listener Julie Terwilliger heard that SCBB was now the sole provider of blood products for Manatee Memorial Hospital and Lakewood Ranch Medical Center, she felt a responsibility to donate. Challenged by her younger sister to become a blood donor, Julie has been donating blood three times a year for 15 years. The

Manatee County resident has three children; Kenneth, 16, who attends Lakewood Ranch High School; Emily, 13, and Elizabeth, 11, both students at Nolan Middle School. Julie, a special education teacher's assistant at McNeal Elementary feels, "it is my responsibility to be a blood donor."

"When I heard that SCBB was providing the blood for Manatee Memorial and Lakewood Ranch, I wanted to support the hospitals my family would use. I feel good about giving blood to SCBB because I know they will be there if we need them."

WHY SELECT A LOCAL COMMUNITY BLOOD BANK?

From the CEO & Medical Director

As a local community blood bank, SCBB is in the unique position to be highly responsive to the needs of individual physicians. Ours is a partnership with our hospitals and allows us to provide the highest quality healthcare possible to our citizens and visitors.



We were honored when approached by Manatee Healthcare Systems to become the sole provider of blood products and services for Manatee Memorial Hospital and Lakewood Ranch Medical Center. Accepting this new challenge required considerable deliberations by our board of directors and senior staff. To fully meet the needs of these two hospitals would require an additional 9000 units of red cells and 850 units of platelets annually. Direct patient therapeutic procedures would increase by as much as 75%. We would need to open a minimum of two new collection centers in Bradenton and Lakewood Ranch, acquire hundreds of thousands of dollars in collection equipment and hire additional staff.

Our decision was predicated on two principles: 1) the expansion could not impinge on existing service to our hospitals and patients, and 2) we would need to hire the staff and acquire the instruments necessary to assure the same level of service to the Manatee hospitals, patients and donors.

The analysis concluded that our operational efficiencies, combined with our highly skilled staff, assured success, allowing us to embrace this new partnership.

Our partnership is not limited to the hospitals we serve. If not for the thousands of volunteer blood donors, neither SCBB nor the hospitals in our community could function. We look forward to working with the people and communities of Manatee County so

that together we provide Manatee Memorial Hospital and Lakewood Ranch Medical Center with the best healthcare in the region. We will open two new locations in Manatee County by the end of the year. In the meantime, any resident wishing to donate blood can do so at the blood mobile located in the Manatee Memorial Hospital parking lot every Monday from 9am to 3pm.

Anonymous donors make a major gift

We affectionately refer to platelets as liquid gold and those who donate this precious fluid as a rare breed. The Spring 2010 issue of The Pulse featured a story about our need to acquire a new platelet collection instrument called a Trima. A local couple read the story and presented SCBB with a check for the full \$55,000 purchase price. They have personal family experience with the critical need for platelets, and they believe in giving back to their community. They also wish to remain anonymous so we'll just call them our secret angels.

Grant for Information Technology Study

SCBB received an \$18,000 grant from the Gulf Coast Community Foundation of Venice to conduct an information technology study. The study analyzed the blood bank's technical operations and processes, to help it maximize efficiencies, and evaluated the business processes for

redundancies in order to identify potential cost savings. The findings and recommendations of the study will be implemented in the coming fiscal year.

A message from Rhonda Peters, Director of Development

SCBB has a fleet of seven bloodmobiles (buses) that conduct over 1000 blood drives throughout Sarasota, Manatee and DeSoto counties each and every year. The average number of miles on our buses is 100,000!

Our bloodmobiles are the work horses of our collections team. They are our mobile blood banks, providing a safe, comfortable and cozy environment for donors. They allow us to travel where it is most convenient for our donors: to schools, churches, businesses, community centers. We work these buses like mules – generating the power required to run the air conditioning and collection instruments and traveling well over 100,000 miles. And they have kept their promise of service to us. Yet, we must prepare for the inevitable retirement of at least one of these buses in the next few years.

As members of our collection team, each of our bloodmobiles have been given names to personalize them. Consider their ages and years of service.

In order of seniority...

Half Pint – 22 years old

Lifesaver – 18 years old

Life Force – 15 years old

Charity – 13 years old

Blood Hound – 13 years old

Quick Draw – 5 years old

Blood Vessel – 4 years old

While no one can be certain as to Robert Frost's meaning behind his celebrated poem “Stopping by Woods on a Snowy Evening,” what seems evident is the notion of commitment and responsibility. SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

Suncoast Communities Blood Bank awarded 45 graduating seniors with scholarships totaling \$26,150 to pursue post-secondary education opportunities. This year marked the highest participation in applicants and funds awarded since the program began five years ago. SCBB employees contributed over \$6,000 to the Generation Give fund through the "Dollar for Scholars" program. The program allowed contributions to be made through payroll deductions and fundraising activities. On June 10, 2010, SCBB hosted a dinner and reception at Cosimo's Too at Westfield Mall to present the scholarships.

During the 2009-2010 school year, SCBB registered 3,209 students and collected 2,725 units of blood which represents 10% of total donations.
